These goals are seamlessly integrated into our curriculum to ensure holistic development and to instil essential life skills, values, ethics, and character at every developmental stage.

Rooted in the philosophy of holistic development, we incorporate the five koshas—Annamaya Kosha (Physical), Pranamaya Kosha (Energy), Manomaya Kosha (Mind), Vijnanamaya Kosha (Wisdom), and Anandamaya Kosha (Bliss)—to nurture every aspect of a child's growth. These are through the following domains

- <u>Language and Literacy</u> Encouraging self-expression through storytelling, journaling, and affirmations.
- <u>Cognitive Development</u> Fostering problem-solving skills, critical thinking, and curiositydriven learning.
- <u>Physical Development</u> Enhancing strength, coordination, and well-being through movement and mindfulness activities.
- <u>Aesthetic and Cultural Development</u> Cultivating creativity, appreciation for diversity, and artistic expression.
- <u>Social-Emotional and Ethical Development</u> Building confidence, resilience, empathy, and gratitude.

At DPS Surajkund, we believe that children learn best when knowledge is interconnected and meaningful to children. For the months of April and May, our 'Marvellous Me' planner is centred on self-discovery, self-love, and continuous self-improvement. At DPSSK, our curriculum is thoughtfully designed to provide experiential learning through STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) activities, seamlessly aligned with the National Curriculum Framework 2022. Moving forward, we remain committed to fostering holistic skill development across multiple domains outlined in the framework, ensuring that learning is engaging, meaningful, and deeply integrated through hands-on STEAM-based experiences.

What could STEM look like for our youngest learners?

- Science Observing nature through nature walks, engaging in simple experiments like color mixing and sink or float, exploring cooking activities, and learning about pets and their care.
- **Technology** Enhancing fine motor skills and practical understanding by using scissors, utensils, coloring and drawing tools, and exploring how different objects and tools help us in daily life.
- **Engineering** Encouraging building, problem-solving, and design thinking by taking apart and reconstructing boxes, drawing and following a design plan, and creating structures using a variety of blocks and materials.
- Mathematics Developing mathematical thinking by counting objects, matching clothes, identifying shapes in food (e.g., sandwiches), using positional words, sorting a variety of objects, and comparing different items to recognize patterns and relationships.











STEAM Based Activities for the Month:

- **My Growing Hands** Helps children understand measurement, comparison, and body awareness.
- **Emotion Bottles** Helps children recognize, express, and regulate emotions through visual observation.
- Build a Body Puzzle Helps children learn about body parts and spatial arrangement.
